

In light of the ongoing levy campaign, the School District has received multiple inquiries about the status of the roof litigation at our K-2 and 3-12 school buildings. As many in the community are aware, the Amanda Clearcreek Local School District partnered with the Ohio School Facilities Commission to construct its K-2 and 3-12 school buildings through the state of Ohio's Classroom Facilities Assistance Program. The high winds of the surrounding areas have caused significant and ongoing damage to the shingle roofs of the buildings, and resulted in substantial shingle blow-off and water infiltration. The School District has requested that the OSFC co-fund the costs of an alternative roof system designed to withstand the wind pressures dislodging shingles from the buildings. The ongoing litigation is to determine what duties the OSFC owes to the School District on the joint project. The lawsuit is currently before Judge Trimmer in the Fairfield County Court of Common Pleas awaiting his ruling on several pending motions that could potentially bring the trial court matter to resolution. The matter is scheduled for a pretrial conference on April 4, 2017. We will have more information for the community at that time.
