

**Amanda-Clearcreek Local School District Plan of In-Person Instruction
and Continuity of Services
June 30, 2021**

On June 2, 2021, Governor DeWine and the Ohio Department of Health rescinded the K-12 school facial coverings order. Fully vaccinated people in Ohio will no longer be required to wear a mask except in certain crowded indoor settings, such as healthcare and transportation. Governor DeWine has requested that schools and districts design plans that address the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services to meet the needs of students.

Amanda-Clearcreek Local School District has been providing face-to-face instruction, five days a week since August 28, 2020. We have maintained the same standard of high expectations as in previous years. We consistently monitor student progress and use all available data to make decisions that support individual student needs. We have prioritized the social and emotional well-being of our students during the pandemic and are providing support where appropriate. Therefore we will continue to provide face-to-face instruction, five days a week, to our students during the 2021-2022 academic year.

These general principles will guide our school community as we continue services in the Amanda-Clearcreek Local School District.

1. Our school district will implement recommended safety protocols to the highest degree possible while also considering the instructional, behavioral, and social-emotional needs of students.
2. Students, staff, and guests may continue to wear a facial covering
3. Our school district will work closely with the Fairfield County Health Department to promote health and safety in all school buildings.
4. Our school district will be transparent with all stakeholders that some level of risk will always be present when children and school district employees occupy school district facilities.
5. Our school district recognizes the need for consistency in areas of operations while also recognizing that individual differences in classroom sizes, school facilities and building operations may lead to some inconsistencies.
